

EXAMPLES of health collaboratives or coalitions that are partnering to fund a data platform:

Lancaster General Health. Lancaster County has a partnership between three different hospitals (Penn Medicine Lancaster General Health, UPMC Pinnacle, WellSpan Health), with two of them having their own embedded site under one contract. They have used the data and other tools from the platform to help align their CHNA efforts. They also have written one CHNA that is made publicly available on each of the hospital's websites. Marathon County Pulse. Marathon County in Wisconsin is funded through a partnership between the local health department, United Way, and four health care systems. The collective approach meant that one organization wouldn't have to fund it alone (which was impossible), but it also provided a collective benefit to all organizations as well.

Milwaukee Health Care Partnership. Established in 2007, the [Milwaukee Health Care Partnership](#) is a public/private consortium dedicated to improving health care for low-income and underserved populations in Milwaukee county, with the aim of improving health outcomes, reducing disparities and lowering the total cost of care. They have 4 hospitals/health systems contributing to the work of this consortium:

- AdvocateAurora Health
- Ascension Wisconsin
- Children's Hospital of Wisconsin
- Froedtert and Medical College of Wisconsin

Since 2012, the health system members of the Milwaukee Health Care Partnership (AdvocateAuroraHealth, Ascension Wisconsin, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, and Froedtert & Medical College of Wisconsin) have shared the funding and design of Community Health Needs Assessments (CHNAs) in six southeastern Wisconsin counties.
